Tennessee Chamber Announces New Incoming Government Affairs Team for 2017 Legislative Session

State Chamber President & CEO Bradley Jackson Welcomes Schneider, Boyatt to Chamber Team

Charles Schneider, a well-known insider on Capitol Hill, and Ted Boyatt, who has headed up a number of strategic communications and political initiatives, will join Jackson when the legislature convenes next week to help shepherd and guide the Chamber's public policy agenda through the legislative session.

A graduate of the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, Ted Boyatt is the former Communications Director for StudentsFirst Tennessee, now known as TennesseeCAN. A native of Maryville, Boyatt previously worked for House Majority Leader Glen Casada's 2014 re-election campaign and served as Vice Chairman of the Blount County Republican Party from 2009 – 2013.
